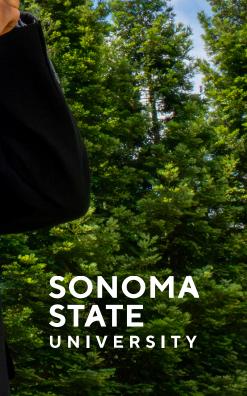

Michael Ching (composer) An opera composer/librettist, conductor, and songwriter, Michael Ching is the composer/librettist of the opera SPEED DATING TONIGHT! With over one hundred fifty productions since its 2013 premiere at the Janiec Opera of the Brevard Music Center, SPEED DATING TONIGHT! is one of the most popular operas of the 21st century. A similarly structured opera is his RSBE. His new opera, NOTES ON VIARDOT had its premiere at University of South Dakota-Vermillion in 2024. Another new opera, HAZEL MINER premiered at Northern State University in 2025. Michael's other well-

known opera is BUOSO'S GHOST. BUOSO is a comic sequel to GIANNI SCHICCHI. BUOSO has been performed at the Florida Grand Opera, Michigan Opera Theatre and OperaDelaware, as well

as at California State University-Fullerton and Montclair State University. During the pandemic, he created ALL DRESSED UP (No Place to Go) for L'arietta Productions in Singapore, a series of nine quarantine-related songs which are now part of SPEED DATING TONIGHT!. In 2018-2019, two new one-act operas had their premieres, THRIVERS, at Palm Springs Opera Guild, and EIGHT WOODS AND A VAN, at the Cedar Rapids Opera Theatre.

Michael is the former Composer-in-Residence at Savannah Voice Festival, a position he now holds at the Taos Opera Institute. He is Opera and Art Song consultant at EC Schirmer Classical and the former Artistic Director of Opera Memphis. He is serving his second term on the board of the National Opera Institute. Michael studied composition with Robert Ward at Duke University and Carlisle Floyd at the Houston Opera Studio.

With a lifelong devotion to the craft of operatic composition learned through the success and failure of over a dozen operas, through composition study, and through years of conducting the standard operatic repertoire; and with a strong interest in folk and country music, Michael is a somewhat of an outlier in the world of new music. Michael lives in St. Paul, Minnesota.

What is Speed Dating Tonight!?

SpDT! Is THE 21st century opera. Conceived on the back porch of a cabin at the Brevard Music Center, Dean Anthony and Michael Ching sought to create a brand new kind of opera, specifically for colleges.

Often the biggest challenge when programming operatic repertoire for the academic environment is finding something that will fit everyone. Sometimes you have the perfect Mimi but no Rodolfo for a 50-mile radius...sometimes you have fifteen sopranos and half a baritone.

Enter: Speed Dating Tonight! This piece has over 100 different daters and ensembles to choose from with nearly each piece coming in high, medium, and low keys. Before you had to force young singers into a box. With Speed Dating Tonight!, young singers can find a perfect vocal match and explore a nearly endless supply of characters to play.

The most beautiful aspect of our Speed Dating Tonight! Production at Sonoma State is that the piece was cast entirely by the performers. I am endlessly proud of their work and know you will be too.
