#### **ABOUT THIS SERIES**

This series is curated and hosted by Professor Brian S. Wilson. Professor Wilson's background is in trombone, piano, music education, composition and conducting and thus has taught just about every course in the curriculum. Versatility is his curse! He teaches music theory and conducts groups for special projects, Music Theory for non-majors and Survey of Jewish Musics. He was formerly the SSU Director of Bands and Music Education and Music Department Chair for 13 years.

A versatile composer, arranger, conductor and educator, Brian Scott Wilson (b. 1962, Lynn, MA) creates music with economy, purpose and humor. Winner of the International Trombone Association Composition Competition for **The Avanti**, Wilson's scoring and sense of pacing have earned him a reputation as a master of craft. Finding inspiration in the music of Stravinsky, Mingus and Varese, Wilson's eclectic style utilizes classic and jazz elements in a way that feels simultaneously familiar and new. His deep spirituality finds expression in works as diverse as **Klezmer Concerto** for clarinet and **Prayer for Peace** for women's choir and orchestra.

Formerly Music Director of the University of Detroit Classic Theatre Study Abroad program, Wilson has participated in conducting master classes by Frederick Fennell and Sergiu Commissiona. An inveterate traveler, he has guest conducted his works in Russia, Poland, Iceland, Israel, Greece, Italy, Latvia, Estonia, Korea, Costa Rica, Canada, France, Switzerland and throughout the US, and spent time performing and doing research in China, France and Germany.

#### JEWISH STUDIES PROGRAM

#### ABOUT THE ARTIST

Cantor Arik Luck is thrilled to have been invited to perform at Sonoma State University. Since 2015, Cantor Luck has served as the Ben and A. Jess Shenson Cantor at Congregation Emanu-El of San Francisco. Previously, he served for six years at Beth Emet The Free Synagogue, in Evanston, IL. In addition to his full-time work as cantor and clergy, Cantor Luck has appeared as a principle soloist in numerous concerts throughout the country, including Siamsa na nGael: If It Weren't For the Irish and the Jews (Chicago Symphony Center, with Martin Sheen), Schoenberg's A Survivor From Warsaw (Skokie Valley Symphony Orchestra), Standing Out/Fitting In: Jewish Stories/American Songs (Aspen, CO), and Abraham's Children: A Prayer for Peace (Indiana University, with Iraqi tenor Omer Turkmenoglu). Cantor Luck once received the honor of leading Shabbat evening services at the URJ (Union for Reform Judaism) Biennial Convention, before an in-person congregation of 5,000 attendees from across North America and beyond. His musical revue dedicated to the life of Moishe Oysher has been performed throughout the US and internationally. A live record album of the performance, entitled Arik Luck is Moishe Oysher: The Master Singer of His People! is available online for purchase and streaming. Cantor Luck has served on the faculty of the URJ Summer Learning Institute, is a proud seventh year faculty member of URJ Camp Newman, and previously served five years on faculty at Olin Sang Ruby Union Institute (OSRUI), the URJ summer camp in Oconomowoc, WI. Last season, Cantor Luck had the tremendous honor of singing the National Anthem for both our San Francisco Giants and our Golden State Warriors. Cantor Luck will next be seen in concert in Koleinu: Hear Our Voices, on February 7, 2023, at Congregation Emanu-El of San Francisco. This will be followed in April 2023, with an appearance as the principle cantorial soloist in a special presentation of the Bloch Sacred Service, with full orchestra and choir, at the Montview Boulevard Presbyterian Church of Denver, CO.

Cantor Luck is a member of the American Conference of Cantors (ACC), was a founding member and former president of the Reform Cantors of Chicago (RCC), holds a Masters Degree of Sacred Music from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, Debbie Friedman School of Sacred Music, and was ordained as a cantor by HUC-JIR DFSSM in 2009. He also received a BFA from the Carnegie Mellon University School of Drama (2000). Cantor Luck resides in San Francisco with his family.
