PROGRAM NOTES

"Standin' in the Rain" was released on ELO's *Out of the Blue* album in October of 1977. It is the first song on side three, the entirety of which is subtitled, "Concerto for a Rainy Day."

Rumors, the eleventh studio album by Fleetwood Mac, was recorded primarily in Sausalito, California, and was released in February 1977. The second track on the album, "Dreams," was released as a single the next month. Both the album and the single reached No. 1 on the Billboard charts, the album occupying that position for 31 weeks.

"Midas Man" is the third track on Renaissance's seventh studio album, *Novella*, which was released in the U.S. in January 1977.

Released September 1977, *Aja* is the sixth studio album by Steely Dan. The title track is perhaps the band's best example of Jazz-infused pop/rock. *Aja* peaked at No. 3 on the *Billboard 200*.

"Pretty Vacant" is the ninth track on *Never Mind the Bollocks, Here's the Sex Pistols*, the first and only studio album by the Sex Pistols. After its U.K. release in October 1977 it immediately rose to the top of the U.K. album charts.
