NOTES

Recorded in February 2007, "Crushcrushcrush" was first released on 12 June 2007 on Paramore's second studio album, *Riot!*, and then as a single in November of the same year. The band's label, Fueled by Ramen, is owned by Warner Music Group.

"Cornerstone" appears on the third album by the Arctic Monkeys, *Humbug*, released on 18 August 2009 by Domino Recording Company. The song was released a single on 16 November 2009. "Cornerstone" contains a reference to a pub in Sheffield called The Frog and Parrot. The pub had a secret bar upstairs called The Parrot's Beak, where members of the Arctic Monkeys often had a few pints and food when they were 17-year-olds.¹

Jimmy Eat World's "The Middle" appears on the band's fourth studio album, *Bleed American*, released in July of 2001. The album was self-financed by the band after they had been dropped by Capitol Records in 1999, and the lyrics to "The Middle" reflect the group's experiences at the time.

"Questions 67 and 68" was released on Chicago's first album, *Chicago Transit Authority*, in 1969. The numbers in the title refer to the years 1967 and 1968 and a romantic relationship Robert Lamm during that time.

"La Villa Strangiato" was released on the Rush's *Hemispheres* album on 24 October 1978 by Mercury Records. Bassist Geddy Lee noted that the piece "is basically a loose association of crazy ideas that worked under this grand theme and the grand excuse that it's supposed to represent Alex Lifeson's dreams." Apparently, Lifeson did have some very unusual dreams. Whatever the inspiration, "La Villa Strangiato" is comprised of 12 segments: 1) Buenos Nochas, Mein Froinds!, 2) To Sleep, Perchance To Dream, 3) Strangiato Theme, 4) A Lerxst in Wonderland, 5) Monsters!, 6) The Ghost of the Aragon, 7) Danforth and Pape, 8) The Waltz of the Shreves, 9) Never Turn Your Back on a Monster!, 10) Monsters! (Reprise), 11) Strangiato Theme (Reprise), 12) A Farewell To Things. The "Monsters!" passages quote the middle section of Raymond Scott's "Powerhouse" of 1936, as have dozens of cartoons. "Danforth and Pape" refers to an intersection in Toronto, the city in which Rush formed in 1968.

Billie Joe Armstrong's lyrics for "Holiday" reflect his frustration with the national rhetoric surrounding the US invasion of Iraq in March of 2003. The song was first released on the *American Idiot* in September 2004, and later as a single in March of 2005.

"Fell in Love with a Girl" was first release on The White Stripes's *White Blood Cells* on 3 July 2001, then as a single on 25 February 2002. The album was recorded in three days, an intentionally brief production schedule to make it sound "unorganized," according to Jack White.³

The fifth track on The Red Hot Chili Peppers's Eight Album, *By the Way* (2002), "Don't Forget Me" is built on four repeated chords played on the bass.

Tool's second studio album, Ænima, was released in September of 1996. "Forty Six & 2" was the fourth single released from the album. Ænima is the first Tool album for bassist Justin Chancellor.

"Optimistic" is the sixth track on Radiohead's *Kid A*, the group's fourth studio album. It was released in October 2000 on the Parlophone label. It represents the band's departure from more Rock-oriented writing after 1997's *OK Computer*.

"I Know the End" was released on 18 July 2020 on Bridgers's second album, *Punisher*, and as a single on 29 July 2020, on the Dead Oceans label. It was recorded at the legendary Sound City Studio in Van Nuys, California.
